MUSEUM AUDIENCE

- In 2025, the Museum served 79,000 individuals
- The Museum has over 4,000 members

VISITORS:

- 70% of Museum visitors are from Saratoga County
- 25% from the Capital Region
- 5% are tourists
- Saratoga is the fastest growing county in the Capital Region
- Saratoga is the wealthiest county in the region
- The Museum is designed for children 0-10 and their caregivers
- Typical visitor group is a caregiver with 2-3 children
- The Museum serves 11 Capital Region Counties
